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My interest in photography began in my teens (as a Photostat operator for Street and Smith publications) and developed while serving in the Air Corps with the army of occupation in Paris. There I learned darkroom work from a German POW. Back in New York I continued my photographic education for about a year. But I decided that I had to choose photography as a livelihood or as my creative expression. I couldn't do both, so I chose the latter.

The bulk of my work is on the streets of New York, being my main hunting ground for the past forty years. I try to tell a story with my photographs - sometimes sad, other times funny - while maintaining good printing and composition.

My recent series of digital abstracts started from mass displays on supermarket shelves. With digital manipulation, out came a series of structured designs.
